MCM 5:

No privately owned stormwater management facilities were inspected in FY 2019. There are only 11 privately owned SMF in the City, and they were inspected in FY 2018. Since the permit requirement is to inspect once every five years, none were inspected in FY 2019.

MCM 6:

There were no training events conducted in FY 2019; the permit requires training events every other year. Training had been performed in FY 2018 for Public Works and Parks and Recreation (see FY 2018 Annual Report), and will be performed again in FY 2020.

CHESAPEAKE BAY TMDL INFORMATION:

All BMPs implemented during the reporting period were entered into the DEQ BMP Warehouse.

The City of Manassas Park meets all of its current nutrient reduction requirements through the use of nutrient credits obtained from the Upper Occoquan Service Authority (UOSA), of which Manassas Park is part owner. Credits available for FY 2019 (assumes UOSA and Manassas Park have the same delivery rate to the Bay):
